My name is David Conder Sr. and I am writing on behalf of Mr. Tyler Hunt. Tyler was one of the scouts in the troop I had the honor of leading as Scoutmaster for about 5 years. He was in the troop for around 4 years of that. His determination, outlook on life, cooperation with others, and critical thinking skills were all apparent.

There were times when Tyler wasn't thrilled about some of the activities our troop had planned. However, whether the reason was trepidation, uncertainty, or being unfamiliar with the activity. Tyler did his best to push through any reservations and complete the activity. His determination often served as an example to other scouts. He always contributed to the troop both as an individual and as a team member. Weather, circumstances, hunger, long days, or even personal injuries were just obstacles to overcome.

Another troop leader and I were taking a few scouts on a preparation hike to build readiness for a very long backpacking trip. We were about a mile and a half into the trail with about 3 miles to go for the day before making camp. Tyler was two people in front of me and must have lost his footing. Tyler is teachable and quick to learn. He retains information really well, especially if he finds it particularly interesting. He very seldom questioned the instructions I or other troop leaders gave him and if he did feel the need to do so, was respectful, (and usually made really good observations).

I was happy to have Tyler in my troop. Over all, he maintained a positive outlook and wanted to do his best in whatever he did. As individuals go, Tyler Hunt is genuinely a wonderful human being.
